INFORMATION FOR OWNERS & TRAINERS

BADGE ALLOCATION:

Every Owner, Partnership and Syndicate is entitled to six Owners' badges with lunch per runner. Registered Syndicates may have up to twelve badges in exchange for lunch.

We ask that the syndicate manager agrees the allocation of badges under their management in advance of the meeting. Please be reminded that it is the responsibility of the syndicate or partnership manager to inform their owners of our dress code and specific lunch arrangements made on their behalf and in advance.

Trainers with runners on the day and Jockeys with a ride will be entitled to two Owners' badges each. Owners of horses that are entered but not declared, can be offered two Richmond Enclosure badges for that day.

Badges can only be collected from the Owners' & Trainers' desk at the Richmond Enclosure Entrance close to Car Park 6.

Please present your PASS card or QR code confirmation from the PASS system. We reserve the right to ask for ID before any badges are released.

Please pre-book all your badge requirements, by no later than 4pm the day before via rcapass.com, telephone 01933 270333, or email pass@weatherbys.co.uk.

Due to high demand resulting in frequent sell out at Three Friday Nights, Owners and Trainers are eligible to receive four complimentary tickets only for attendees under 18 for these fixtures.

Parade Ring passes will be race-specific, although there will be day and week passes available for owners and trainers with multiple runners. These can be collected from the Owners' & Trainers' desk when collecting your admission badge.

Accessible viewing is available on request from the member's bar via the internal lift in the March Grandstand or from elevated platforms on the rails just past the finishing line.

Owners are entitled to three Car Park 6 Owners' labels per runner. These will be sent to the registered owner by post (from Weatherbys) prior to the meeting.

Blue Badge disability parking is available on a first-come, first served basis at the front of Car Park 5 next to the Richmond Enclosure entrance (please display your Blue Badge).

Please can we ask that Gazebos are not erected in such a way that they block other car parking spaces. If spaces become too limited, we reserve the right to request they are taken down.

in summer. We recommend that you leave your stiletto heels at home, as the uneven ground can be tricky to walk on.

CHILDREN IN THE PARADE RING

Children under 12 years of age will not be allowed access to the parade ring. Children between the ages of 12-16 must be accompanied by an adult.

Owners of winning horses will be presented with a trophy, a video in a card of the race, and a memory stick of images. They will also receive a celebratory glass of Kinseme Sparkling Wine in the pavilion, with our Owners' & Trainers' representative.

SPRING RACING

OPENING WEEKEND

Friday 3 – Saturday 4 May

Our feature races on the opening weekend are devoted to fillies and mares, with two Listed contests restricted exclusively to them.

This year, both the Listed EBF Daisy Warwick Stakes and the Listed Conqueror Fillies Stakes will be run on Saturday. The former has seen some promising winners down the years, but none more so than Alpinista (rated 113), who was successful in 2021. She shot to frame in the Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and set the standard in recent memory.

Meanwhile, the Conqueror Stakes, which received a boost in prize money last year to £60,000 where it remains, is run for three-year-olds and upwards over a mile. Nyaleti won the 2018 renewal en route to claiming the German 1,000 Guineas, while last year's winner, Roman Mist, proved consistent after that, finishing second in the Group 3 Valiant Stakes before gaining victory in Germany in Group Company.

MAY FESTIVAL

Friday 24 – Saturday 25 May

This year's May Festival features high-quality racing that includes three Listed races: The Height of Fashion Stakes, The EBF Cocked Hat Stakes and The Festival Stakes.

Friday hosts the important Festival Stakes run over one mile and two furlongs, worth £60,000 and won in 2021 by Lone Eagle who went on to finish second to Hurricane Lane in the Irish Derby. King Of Conquest was strong at the finish in 2023 before going on to be consistent in Group races across the season. The Height of Fashion Stakes alongside the EBF Cocked Hat Stakes move to the Saturday this season. The former is run over one mile and two furlongs for £60,000. Won by Araminta for Henry Candy last season, she went on to claim Group 3 success in France.

The EBF Cocked Hat has proved a notable trial for the major classics Khalifa Sat and Lone Eagle are recent winners of the race. Last year, Gregory ran out a ready winner before landing the Group 2 Queen's Vase. In the same colours of Wathnan Racing's Courage Mon Ami stamped his authority in the Class 2 one mile six furlong handicap en route to Ascot Gold Cup domination. Saturday's bumper card also features a £50,000 Fillies' Maiden, making this Goodwood's biggest singular day outside of the flagship Qatar Goodwood Festival with £340,000 in prizemoney on offer.

FAMILY RACE DAY

Sunday 9 June

Family Race Day will host two of the most valuable races of the season outside of the Qatar Goodwood Festival. Worth £70,000 each, the 1 mile 4 furlong Tapster Stakes has provided Mirage Dancer and Hukum with a platform to progress their careers, while the addition of the Listed Agnes Keyser Stakes last year has further boosted the day. Open to fillies and contested over one mile two furlongs, it was won by Al Asifah in its inaugural running at Goodwood last year. It had a decent roll of honour when staged at Newbury, the likes of Sea Of Class and Speedy Boarding are high class winners of the contest.

Successors of this fixture include the likes of Benoit De La Sayette who went on to become Champion Apprentice Jockey at the culmination of the season.

Two decent six-race-cards on Friday 14 June and Friday 21 June see a very competitive blend of handicaps. With a total of £71,000 and £78,000 on offer it provides a competitive appetiser to the remaining Three Friday Nights fixtures.

SUMMER RACING

QATAR GOODWOOD FESTIVAL

Tuesday 30 July – Saturday 3 August

Affectionately known as ‘Glorious Goodwood’, the Qatar Goodwood Festival will be run this year between 30 July – 3 August. The eyes of the racing world will be firmly set on the Sussex Downs for our annual showpiece of high-quality racing and glamour in this most idyllic of settings. We would like to thank our sponsors, both new and established, for their support in making this a week to remember for all concerned, with particular thanks going to our title partner, the Qatar Racing and Equestrian Club. We are delighted that the first three days will again be part of the Hong Kong Jockey Club’s World Pool with UK betting via the Tote.

The Group 1 Al Shaqab Goodwood Cup takes centre stage on day one. Quickthorn was not for catching in last year’s renewal, while the two-mile contest provided a race for the ages in 2022, with a bumper contest going the way of Kyprios for trainer Aiden O’Brien, who touched off the four-time winner Stradivarius. Kinross went one better in this year’s Group 2 £180,000 Lennox Stakes; the ultra-consistent performer ends his career with multiple Group successes to his name. Paddington enhanced his reputation by adding the £1 million Qatar Sussex Stakes to an eight-race winning spree, which included the Irish 2,000

Guineas, St James’s Palace and Eclipse Stakes. The historic race has featured many ‘duels on the downs’ over the years. Thursday is traditionally Ladies’ Day, and to complement this, the Qatar Nassau Stakes (Group 1) will be the feature race on the card. Dierdre made history in 2019 for trainer Mitsuru Hashida and Japan, being the first horse from Japan to win at Goodwood. Hollie Doyle and the Imad Alsaagar-owned Nashwa, who claimed the race in 2022, could only finish third to the doughty Shadwell filly, Al Husn. Elsewhere on the card, Desert Hero provided His Majesty The King with his first success at Goodwood in the John Pearce Racing Gordon Stakes. The £300,000 King George Qatar Stakes (Group 2) over five furlongs saw the Yorkshire-trained Highfield Princess fly home to provide a popular winner for John Quinn and Jason Hart. She went on to win the Group 1 Prix de L’Abbaye de Longchamp. Hamish notched the £100,000 L’Ormarins King’s Plate Glorious Stakes before rounding off a successful season with further Group 3 success at Newmarket. On Saturday, Aberama Gold travelled strongly to score in the most competitive race of the week, the £250,000 Coral Stewards’ Cup. Earlier in the card, Sumo Sam showed a good turn of foot £300,000 Lillie Langtry Stakes; she proved it was no fluke by following up in the Park Hill Fillies’ Stakes.

AUGUST BANK HOLIDAY

Friday 23 – Sunday 25 August

From a breath-taking fireworks display on the Friday evening after racing, to plenty of family fun on Saturday and Sunday, the magical three-day August Bank Holiday fixture rekindles the nostalgic British summer holidays of yesteryear. £699,000 in prize money is up for grabs over three stellar days of horseracing.

Saturday boosts the headline card with the prestigious Group 2 Celebration Mile. Last year, Angel Bleu added a final Group success to his career, this followed a Vintage Stakes win at the Qatar Goodwood Festival in 2021. Other notable winners have included Lightning Spear who went on to Sussex Stakes success. Later in the afternoon, the £80,000 Group 3 Prestige Stakes is an important test for juvenile fillies. Like her sire, Too Darn Hot, Darnation, looked at home at Goodwood stretching away from her rivals in this year's renewal. She went on to record Group 2 victory in the May Hill Stakes for Karl Burke. Billesdon Brook and Amazing Maria have won this en route to bigger things.

The addition of a £75,000 Open Handicap adds interest to Sunday's card which also includes a £50,000 Class 2 Fillies' Maiden and a Class 2 Handicap (0 – 100).

MIDWEEK RACING

Tuesday 3 September

These balmy late summer afternoons are an ideal escape during the working week, offering a chance to experience Goodwood in all its glory with the spectacular seasonally coloured Sussex countryside as a fitting backdrop. Tuesday hosts a seven race card worth over £130,000, a duo of £30,000 races include the Class 2 Conditions race over one mile, open to any 2 Year this should be a nice end of season target for many owners. The Class 2 Handicap for horses rated between 86 – 105 adds interest to the day, this will be run over two miles and has previously attracted smart dual purpose horses.

MIDWEEK RACING

Wednesday 25 September

The £60,000 listed Foundation Stakes is the feature race on this card, won in 2022 by the Charlie Appleby trained Royal Fleet (rated 111). Further competitive action is provided by a £50,000 fillies handicap over one mile and six furlongs for three-year-olds and upwards.

The card also features three 2 year old races which provide the perfect opportunity to see horses that may prosper in big races in the following seasons. The opening race of the day will again be a race over two miles but for jump jockeys. Last year Jack Quinlan landed the spoils while in 2022, it provided Bryony Frost with a popular comeback victory after a long spell on the side lines. The Class 2 Handicap worth £30,000 often provides a spring board for National Hunt horses at the start of their winter campaign, in recent years the likes of Tritonic and Goshen have used the race to get their season underway.

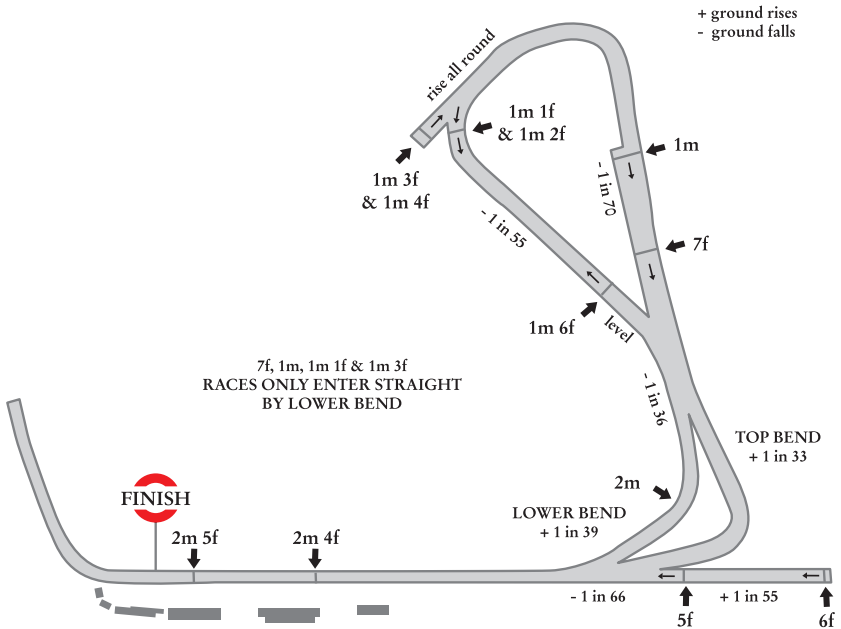

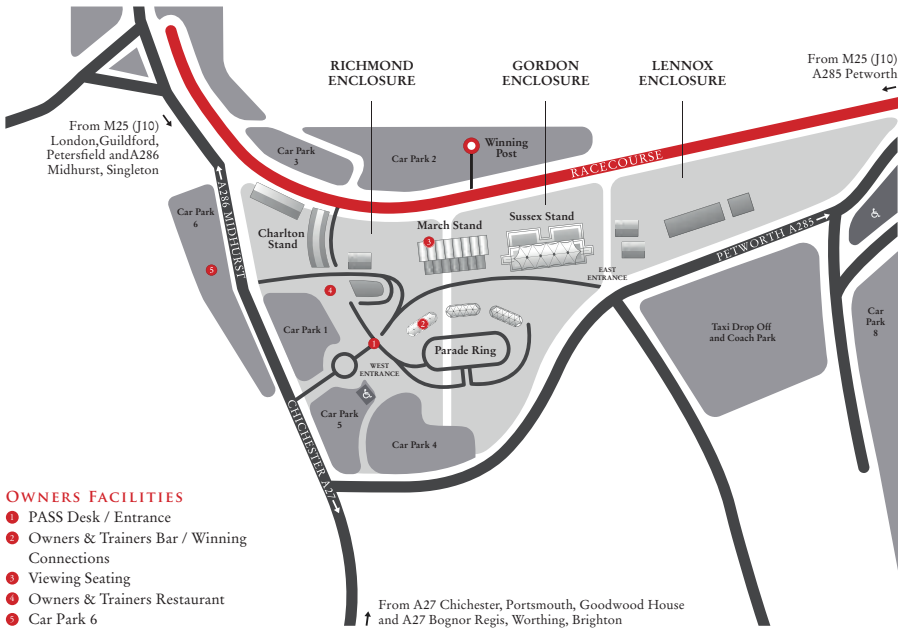
COURSE CHARACTERISTICS
