Please keep your dog on a lead at all times.

Look out for the famous Cedars of Lebanon. Only a few trees remain of the original 1000 planted in 1761 by the 3rd Duke of Richmond.

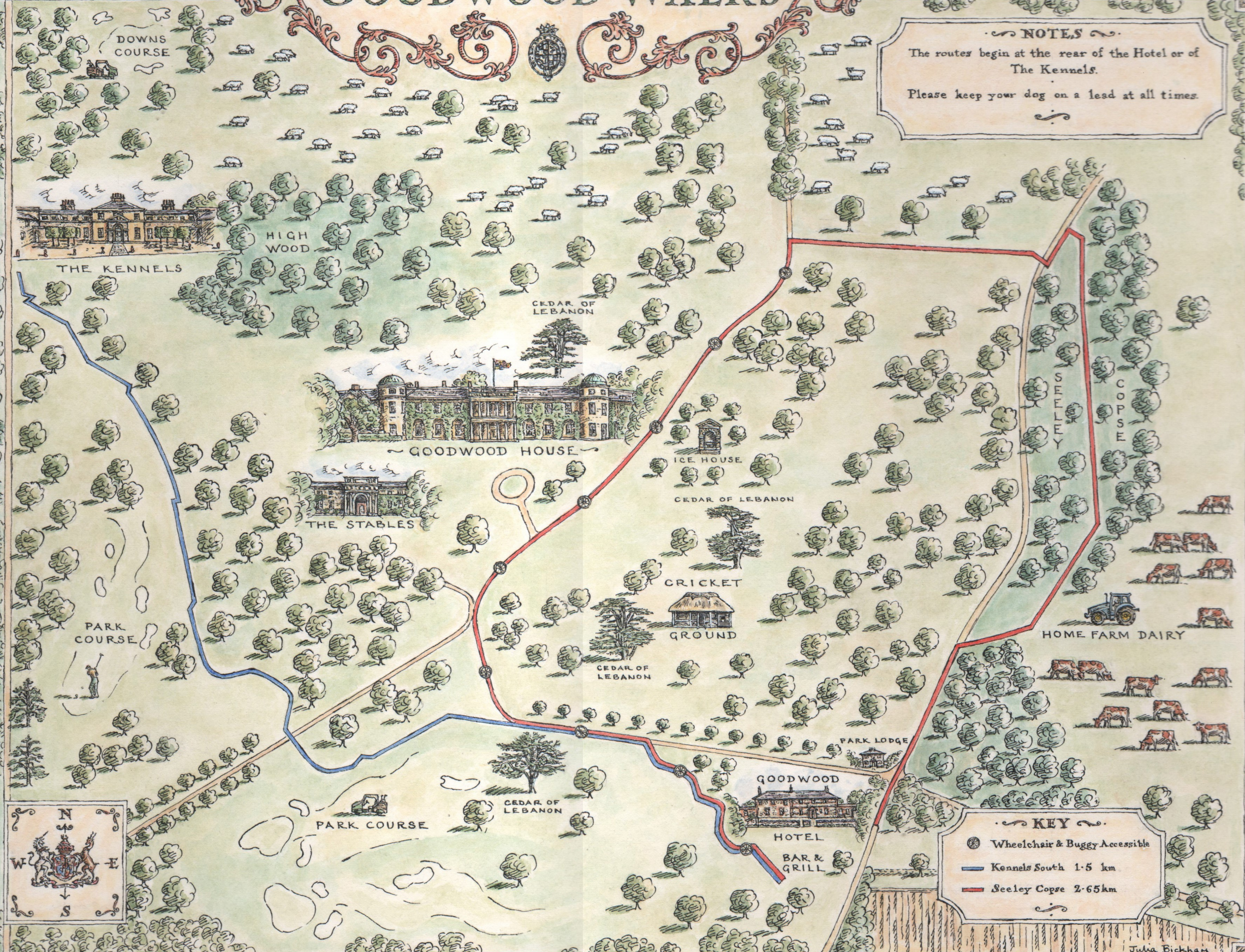
The rules written for a cricket match in 1727 between the 2nd Duke of Richmond and Mr Brodrick are the oldest written set of cricket rules in the world. They are on display in the Goodwood Archive.

The Downs Golf Course was designed by five time Open champion James Braid in 1914

The Home Farm is one of the UK's largest lowland organic farms, supplying meat and dairy products to the Goodwood restaurants and events, and to some of London's top hotels and restaurants.

In the 1730's the 2nd Duke of Richmond kept a menagerie at Goodwood, which included wolves, racoons, Indian pigs, ostriches, a baboon, a lioness, monkeys and wild boar.

Enjoy a cup of tea at The Kennels and the Goodwood Hotel. On certain days scrumptious cream teas are available at Goodwood House (pre-booking required).
