A RECORD-BREAKING FESTIVAL OF SPEED

What Max Chilton and the McMurtry Spéirling managed in Sunday's Shootout will not be forgotten for a long time, but there were memories made all over the Festival of Speed weekend.

t had to be seen to be believed. Two tonnes of downforce from 0mph, created by fans sucking the Spéirling onto the road, and a 0-60mph time of 1.4 seconds. The McMurtry car, piloted by Max Chilton, got faster and faster throughout the weekend and managed a record-breaking 39.081-second climb on Sunday afternoon. The crowd couldn't believe what they had just witnessed.

"I've been attending this event since I was four years old," Chilton said after breaking Nick Heidfeld's official record set in 1999 onboard the McLaren MP4-13 and Romain Dumas' outright record from 2019 in the Volkswagen ID.R.

"If someone had said, 'One day you're going to beat every single person that's ever gone up that Hill,' I wouldn't have believed you. It's a real honour. I didn't sleep last night. I got one hour's sleep because I was so stressed. Pressure makes diamonds, as they say!"

It was just one of many high points in a fantastic weekend that saw action on the Hill, the Forest Rally Stage, in both the Off-Road and GAS arenas, in Future Lab presented by Randox and even on the Cartier lawn.

Nigel Mansell was reunited with his championship-winning Williams FW14B, as well as his Ferrari 639. He even had a go in Jim Clark's Lotus 25, describing it as the best Formula 1 car he'd ever driven. The 1992 Formula 1 World Champion was on great form over the weekend and was joined on the Hill by current Formula 1 drivers such as George Russell and Zhou Guanyu.

There were plenty of lumps in the throat when Wayne Rainey climbed onboard a motorcycle for

the first time in nearly 30 years, flanked by Kenny Roberts, Kevin Schwantz, Mick Doohan and Dani Pedrosa. Many people over the weekend agreed that it was truly one of the most special moments the Festival had ever produced.

Fifty years of BMW's M Division were celebrated in fine style with an extraordinary Gerry Judah sculpture in front of the House and a class of cars from the manufacturer's past, present and future. We also marked Ferrari's 75th anniversary and we looked back at Group C, Group B and Lancia's huge success in rallying.

MURRAY FANS FILL THE KINRARA

For many GRRC members, Thursday evening at the Festival of Speed is one of the high points of the event.

With the Summer Ball in Goodwood House, the exclusive tour of the paddocks and the 'Evening With' event all happening on Thursday evening, it has become a focal point of the weekend.

This year, an audience with Professor Gordon Murray drew a capacity crowd to the Kinrara Enclosure for a rare opportunity to engage with one of the sport's most brilliant and innovative designers. Gordon entertained 280 members with stories of his life in Formula 1, his first road car, the McLaren F1, and his more recent success with his stunning T.50 and T.33 supercars. "A real privilege to meet and listen to a legend of the sport," was typical of the response from those who came to the exclusive 'evening with' a design genius.

Those who chose the Summer Ball, a full

house of 240 members were treated to a champagne reception and a three-course dinner before the Red Bull drift brothers Elias and Johannes Hounondji burst into the night with a

spectacular display in front of the House. Mind-blowing fireworks and dancing to a DJ in Goodwood House rounded off the first day the Festival.





I hope you all enjoyed a terrific 29th Festival of Speed which, I think, was one of the best we have done thanks to a superb collection of both people and machinery.

There were so many highlights, and you will have your own favourites. For me, the sight of Wayne Rainey back onboard his grand prix motorcycle was just so special, as was seeing Nigel Mansell in the Williams in which he won the 1992 Championship.

The Festival brings together such an incredibly eclectic array of the world's best cars and 'bikes, this year reflecting our theme of innovation, which remains at the heart of top-level motor racing. "A ONCE-IN-A-LIFETIME OPPORTUNITY"

Wayne Rainey being back on a motorcycle for the first time in nearly 30 years left an indelible mark on everyone that witnessed it.

Triple world motorcycle champion
Wayne Rainey was back on his Yamaha
YZR500 at the Festival of Speed, the first
time he'd ridden a racing 'bike since his
career-ending accident at the Italian
Grand Prix in 1993. The crash, while
leading the race, and the
championship, left him paralysed
from the chest down. Yamaha
prepared and adapted a YZR500
for him to ride at the Festival using
only handlebar controls.

"It's been exciting, not only to be back riding my Yamaha YZR500, but to be at the Goodwood Festival of Speed for the first time. This was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity that I just didn't want to miss," said Rainey. "After my first run I just wanted to do again, it lasted such a short time up the Hill. I got a little bit quicker each day and on Saturday I popped a wheelie away from

the line. Riding with Kenny, Kevin and Mick has just been so incredible, really quite emotional. Yamaha has done a great job adapting the 'bike so I can ride it using just the handlebar controls. It means a lot for me to be here, for so many years I have

wanted to get back on my bike and, yeah, it feels good. You know, Frank Williams came to see me after my accident and he was incredibly helpful. He said, 'you take what you get, you have to get back out there, do what you love doing,' and that led to me managing a motorcycle team."

"Wayne and I had such a great rivalry,

in 1991 and in '92, and he came out ahead," said Mick Doohan, "so yeah, to be here this weekend is fantastic, for me and for the fans."


"He's a very determined guy," said Kenny Roberts, "when Wayne decided

he wanted to do this it was always going to happen! Riding up that Hill together, what a great moment, and he got more confident each day. And the reception from the crowd was wonderful, unforgettable days."

"Unbelievable," said 1993

champion Kevin Schwantz, "to ride with Wayne again, I never thought that was possible. He was a huge part of my racing life, we were such great rivals, so I was excited to be here."

Wayne Rainey back onboard his GP bike was undoubtedly one of the greatest sights we have ever seen at the Festival.



All eyes were on the Hill when Nigel Mansell was reunited with the Williams FW14B that he raced to the 1992 Formula 1 World Championship. "I'm incredibly honoured to be here at Goodwood in my anniversary year," he said afterwards. "Seeing this car again and making the journey up the Hill have been very special for Williams and myself. I am thrilled to be here with the team, and it was great to be back behind the wheel of this exceptional race car. It's been a very

emotional moment to drive in front of the fans from all over the world and a memory I am going to cherish."

Earlier in the weekend, though, he had a go in Jim Clark's
Lotus 25 and, on reaching the Top Paddock, he was almost speechless.
"My mind is blown, completely and utterly blown," he said with Damon Hill at his side.

"What Graham [Hill] and Jimmy
[Clark], and all those other guys did back
then... This car, this is the best Formula 1
car I have ever driven in my life,

other than getting a lump of grit in my eye on the way up!

The gearbox? Smooth.
The engine? Smooth.
The suspension... It's
unbelievable! Don't film
me getting out, though, I
need two people to help me!"





THE AMERICAN INVASION

This September will see Jimmie Johnson, Scott Dixon and Hélio Castroneves race for the first time at the Revival, alongside Dario Franchitti.

The Revival has seen some of the biggest names in motorsport race historic cars for the first time. This year, the names are particularly special, with the most successful NASCAR Cup Series driver of all time, two of the most successful IndyCar drivers ever and history's joint-most-successful Indy 500 driver. Between them, they have a total of 10 IndyCar championships, eight Indy 500 wins and seven NASCAR Cup Series championships.

Dario Franchitti made an emotional return to racing in 2019 following his injury-enforced retirement from motorsport following an IndyCar crash in 2013. The same year, four-time NASCAR Cup Series champion Jeff Gordon made his debut at the Revival, taking part in in an emotional tribute to Sir Stirling Moss. Johnson, Dixon, Castroneves and Franchitti join the already-announced 2009 F1 World Champion Jenson Button.

The Duke of Richmond said: "It's a privilege to be joined by some of the most renowned and successful IndyCar drivers at this year's Revival. I am so delighted that Helio, Scott, Dario and Jimmie will be joining us this autumn and we are all looking forward to the incredible spectacle these legends of motorsport will bring to the event."
